THE MEIS DONGWHA TIMBERS CHARITY GOLF DAY 2013



Monaro Early Intervention Service (MEIS) in Cooma is gearing up for its annual Charity Golf Day on 18th May at Cooma Golf Club.

If you've played before, then you know it's always an enjoyable event.

This year is the tenth anniversary of their golf day, so they're making it a special one.

There's a hole in one competition worth \$21,000 sponsored by Mitre 10 Cooma. If you score a hole in one on the 9th, you'll win \$20,000 for the MEIS Building Fund and \$1,000 for yourself! It won't affect your amateur status but it will make your local

celebrity status go through the roof! (Only amateurs are eligible to win the hole in one prize.)

MEIS is a non profit, non Government, community based centre which provides support to families with kids aged 0-6 years with disabilities and developmental delays. They have a purpose built centre in Cooma that services the needs of families across the three shires of Bombala, Snowy and Cooma Monaro. Money raised from this golf day will go towards paying off the loan on a property they bought next door to cater for their expanding numbers.

And because this is their 10th annual charity golf day, they're aiming to raise at least \$10,000.
