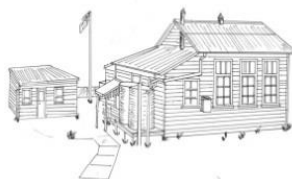

On Monday the school went to Dubbo zoo. My favourite part was the tigers because when the zookeeper put a chicken neck in the cage the tiger would jump up for it.

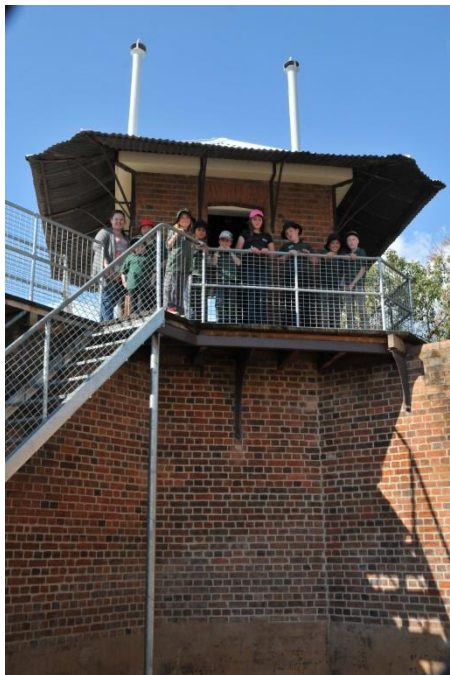

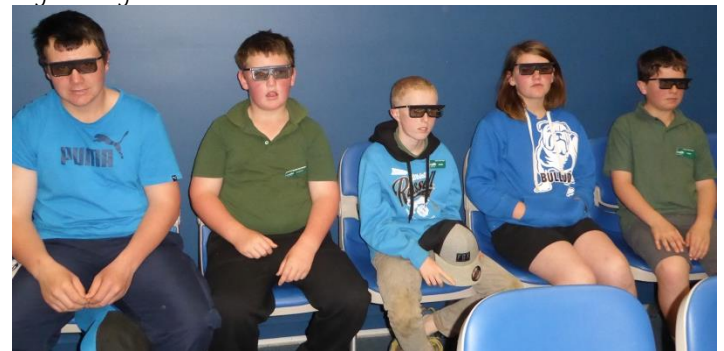

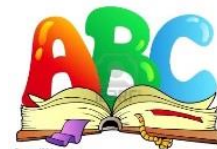
Jerangle Playgroup

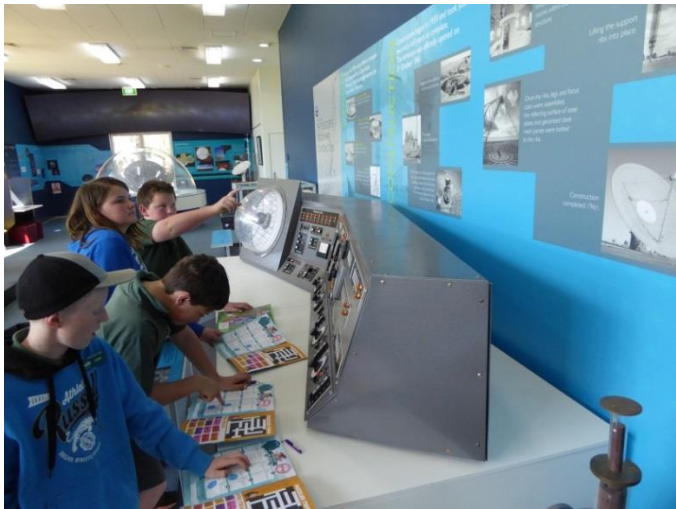




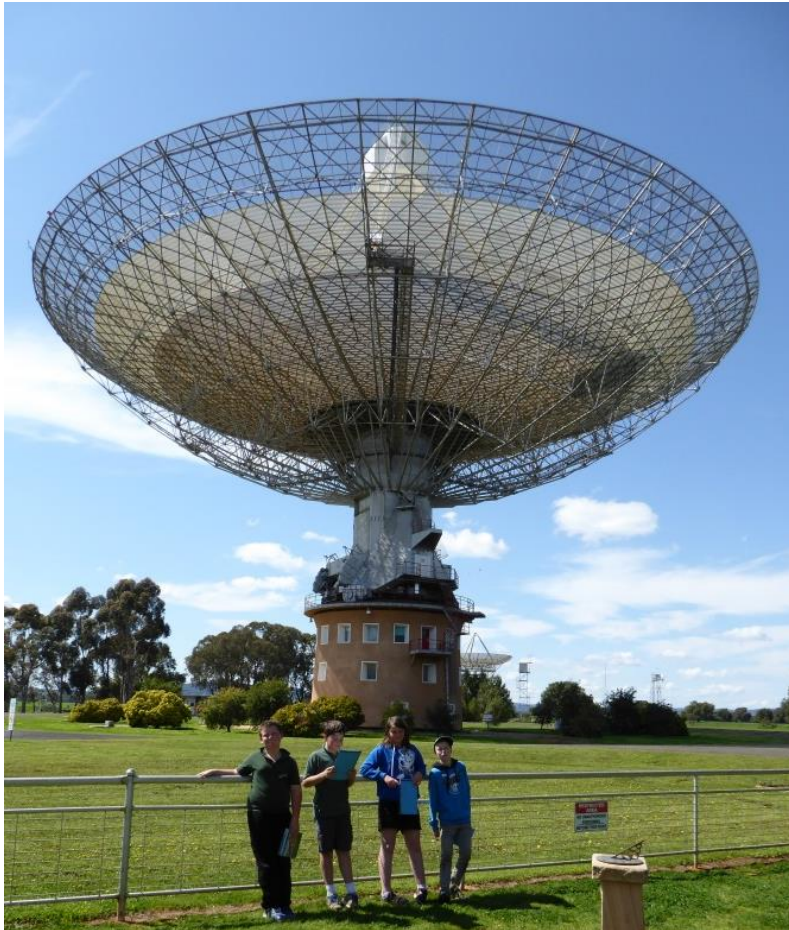
